
































THE GLOBAL GOALS





END POVERTY EVERYWHERE IN ALL ITS FORMS

- 1. Eradicate extreme poverty for all people everywhere, currently measured as people living on less than \$1.25 a day.
- 2. Reduce at least by half the proportion of men, women and children of all ages living in poverty in all its dimensions according to national definitions
- 3. Implement nationally appropriate social protection systems and measures for all, including floors, and by 2030 achieve substantial coverage of the poor and the vulnerable
- 4. Ensure that all men and women, particularly the poor and the vulnerable, have equal rights to economic resources, as well as access to basic services, ownership, and control over land and other forms of property, inheritance, natural resources, appropriate new technology, and financial services including micro-finance.
- 5. Build the resilience of the poor and those in vulnerable situations, and reduce their exposure and vulnerability to climaterelated extreme events and other economic, social and environmental shocks and disasters

END HUNGER, ACHIEVE FOOD SECURITY AND IMPROVED NUTRITION, AND PROMOTE SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE



- End hunger and ensure access by all people, in particular the poor and people in vulnerable situations including infants, to safe, nutritious and sufficient food all year round
- 2. End all forms of malnutrition, including achieving by 2025 the internationally agreed targets on stunting and wasting in children under five years of age, and address the nutritional needs of adolescent girls, pregnant and lactating women, and older persons
- 3. Double the agricultural productivity and the incomes of small-scale food producers, particularly women, indigenous peoples, family farmers, pastoralists and fishers, including through secure and equal access to land, other productive resources and inputs, knowledge, financial services, markets, and opportunities for value addition and non-farm employment
- 4. Ensure sustainable food production systems and implement resilient agricultural practices that increase productivity and production, that help maintain ecosystems, that strengthen capacity for adaptation to climate change, extreme weather, drought, flooding and other disasters, and that progressively improve land and soil quality
- 5. Maintain genetic diversity of seeds, cultivated plants, farmed and domesticated animals and their related wild species, including through soundly managed and diversified seed and plant banks at national, regional and international levels, and ensure access to and fair and equitable sharing of benefits arising from the utilization of genetic resources and associated traditional knowledge as internationally agreed

ENSURE HEALTHY LIVES AND PROMOTE WELL-BEING FOR ALL AT ALL AGES



- 1. Reduce the global maternal mortality ratio to less than 70 per 100,000 live births
- 2. End preventable deaths of newborns and under-five children
- 3. End the epidemics of AIDS, tuberculosis, malaria, and neglected tropical diseases and combat hepatitis, water-borne diseases, and other communicable diseases
- 4. Reduce by one-third pre-mature mortality from non-communicable diseases (NCDs) through prevention and treatment, and promote mental health and wellbeing
- 5. Strengthen prevention and treatment of substance abuse, including narcotic drug abuse and harmful use of alcohol
- 6. Halve global deaths and injuries from road traffic accidents
- 7. Ensure universal access to sexual and reproductive health care services, including for family planning, information and education, and the integration of reproductive health into national strategies and programmes
- 8. Achieve universal health coverage (UHC), including financial risk protection, access to quality essential health care services, and access to safe, effective, quality, and affordable essential medicines and vaccines for all
- 9. Substantially reduce the number of deaths and illnesses from hazardous chemicals and air, water, and soil pollution and contamination



ENSURE INCLUSIVE AND EQUITABLE QUALITY EDUCATION AND PROMOTE LIFE-LONG LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES FOR ALL



- 1. Ensure that all girls and boys complete free, equitable and quality primary and secondary education leading to relevant and effective learning outcomes
- 2. Ensure that all girls and boys have access to quality early childhood development, care and pre-primary education so that they are ready for primary education
- 3. Ensure equal access for all women and men to affordable quality technical, vocational and tertiary education, including university
- 4. Increase by x% the number of youth and adults who have relevant skills, including technical and vocational skills, for employment, decent jobs and entrepreneurship
- 5. Eliminate gender disparities in education and ensure equal access to all levels of education and vocational training for the vulnerable, including persons with disabilities, indigenous peoples, and children in vulnerable situations
- 6. Ensure that all youth and at least x% of adults, both men and women, achieve literacy and numeracy
- 7. Ensure all learners acquire knowledge and skills needed to promote sustainable development, including among others through education for sustainable development and sustainable lifestyles, human rights, gender equality, promotion of a culture of peace and non-violence, global citizenship, and appreciation of cultural diversity and of culture's contribution to sustainable development

ACHIEVE GENDER EQUALITY AND EMPOWER ALL WOMEN AND GIRLS



- 1. End all forms of discrimination against all women and girls everywhere
- 2. Eliminate all forms of violence against all women and girls in public and private spheres, including trafficking and sexual and other types of exploitation
- 3. Eliminate all harmful practices, such as child, early and forced marriage and female genital mutilations
- 4. Recognize and value unpaid care and domestic work through the provision of public services, infrastructure and social protection policies, and the promotion of shared responsibility within the household and the family as nationally appropriate
- 5. Ensure women's full and effective participation and equal opportunities for leadership at all levels of decision-making in political, economic, and public life
- 6. Ensure universal access to sexual and reproductive health and reproductive rights as agreed in accordance with the Programme of Action of the ICPD and the Beijing Platform for Action and the outcome documents of their review conferences

ENSURE AVAILABILITY AND SUSTAINABLE MANAGEMENT OF WATER AND SANITATION FOR ALL



UNITED NATIONS

- 1. Achieve universal and equitable access to safe and affordable drinking water for all
- 2. Achieve access to adequate and equitable sanitation and hygiene for all, and end open defecation, paying special attention to the needs of women and girls and those in vulnerable situations
- 3. Improve water quality by reducing pollution, eliminating dumping and minimizing release of hazardous chemicals and materials, halving the proportion of untreated wastewater, and increasing recycling and safe reuse by x% globally
- 4. Substantially increase water-use efficiency across all sectors and ensure sustainable withdrawals and supply of freshwater to address water scarcity, and substantially reduce the number of people suffering from water scarcity
- 5. Implement integrated water resources management at all levels, including through transboundary cooperation as appropriate

6. Protect and restore water-related ecosystems, including mountains, forests, wetlands, rivers, aquifers and lakes

ENSURE ACCESS TO AFFORDABLE, RELIABLE, SUSTAINABLE, AND MODERN ENERGY FOR ALL



- 1.Ensure universal access to affordable, reliable, and modern energy services
- 2. Increase substantially the share of renewable energy in the global energy mix by 2030
- 3. Double the global rate of improvement in energy efficiency by 2030





PROMOTE SUSTAINED, INCLUSIVE AND SUSTAINABLE ECONOMIC GROWTH, FULL AND PRODUCTIVE EMPLOYMENT AND DECENT WORK FOR ALL

- 1. Sustain per capita economic growth in accordance with national circumstances, and in particular at least 7% per annum GDP growth in the least developed countries
- 2. Achieve higher levels of productivity of economies through diversification, technological upgrading and innovation, including through a focus on high value added and labour-intensive sectors
- 3. Promote development-oriented policies that support productive activities, decent job creation, entrepreneurship, creativity and innovation, and encourage formalization and growth of micro-, small- and medium-sized enterprises including through access to financial services
- 4. Improve progressively through 2030 global resource efficiency in consumption and production, and endeavour to decouple economic growth from environmental degradation in accordance with the 10-year framework of programmes on sustainable consumption and production with developed countries taking the lead
- 5. Achieve full and productive employment and decent work for all women and men, including for young people and persons with disabilities, and equal pay for work of equal value
- 6. Substantially reduce the proportion of youth not in employment, education or training
- 7. Take immediate and effective measures to secure the prohibition and elimination of the worst forms of child labour, eradicate forced labour, and by 2025 end child labour in all its forms including recruitment and use of child soldiers
- 8. Protect labour rights and promote safe and secure working environments of all workers, including migrant workers, particularly women migrants, and those in precarious employment
- 9. Devise and implement policies to promote sustainable tourism which creates jobs, promotes local culture and products
- 10. Strengthen the capacity of domestic financial institutions to encourage and to expand access to banking, insurance and financial services for all

BUILD RESILIENT INFRASTRUCTURE, PROMOTE INCLUSIVE AND SUSTAINABLE INDUSTRIALIZATION AND FOSTER INNOVATION





- 1. Develop quality, reliable, sustainable and resilient infrastructure, including regional and trans-border infrastructure, to support economic development and human well-being with a focus on affordable and equitable access for all
- 2. Promote inclusive and sustainable industrialization, and by 2030 raise significantly industry's share of employment and GDP in line with national circumstances, and double its share in LDCs
- 3.Increase the access of small-scale industrial and other enterprises, particularly in developing countries, to financial services including affordable credit and their integration into value chains and markets
- 4. Upgrade infrastructure and retrofit industries to make them sustainable, with increased resource use efficiency and greater adoption of clean and environmentally sound technologies and industrial processes, all countries taking action in accordance with their respective capabilities
- 5. Enhance scientific research, upgrade the technological capabilities of industrial sectors in all countries, particularly developing countries, including by 2030 encouraging innovation and increasing the number of R&D workers per one million people by x% and public and private R&D spending







REDUCE INEQUALITY WITHIN AND AMONG COUNTRIES

- 1. Progressively achieve and sustain income growth of the bottom 40% of the population at a rate higher than the national average
- 2. Empower and promote the social, economic and political inclusion of all irrespective of age, sex, disability, race, ethnicity, origin, religion or economic or other status
- 3. Ensure equal opportunity and reduce inequalities of outcome, including through eliminating discriminatory laws, policies and practices and promoting appropriate legislation, policies and actions in this regard
- 4. Adopt policies especially fiscal, wage, and social protection policies and progressively achieve greater equality
- 5. Improve regulation and monitoring of global financial markets and institutions and strengthen implementation of such regulations
- 6. Ensure enhanced representation and voice of developing countries in decision making in global international economic and financial institutions in order to deliver more effective, credible, accountable and legitimate institutions
- 7. Facilitate orderly, safe, regular and responsible migration and mobility of people, including through implementation of planned and well-managed migration policies

MAKE CITIES AND HUMAN SETTLEMENTS INCLUSIVE, SAFE, RESILIENT AND SUSTAINABLE



- 1.Ensure access for all to adequate, safe and affordable housing and basic services, and upgrade slums
- 2. Provide access to safe, affordable, accessible and sustainable transport systems for all, improving road safety notably by expanding public transport, with special attention to the needs of those in vulnerable situations, women, children, persons with disabilities and older persons
- 3. Enhance inclusive and sustainable urbanization and capacities for participatory, integrated and sustainable human settlement planning and management in all countries
- 4.Strengthen efforts to protect and safeguard the world's cultural and natural heritage
- 5. Significantly reduce the number of deaths and the number of affected people and decrease by y% the economic losses relative to GDP caused by disasters, including water-related disasters, with the focus on protecting the poor and people in vulnerable situations
- 6. Reduce the adverse per capita environmental impact of cities, including by paying special attention to air quality, municipal and other waste management
- Provide universal access to safe, inclusive and accessible, green and public spaces, particularly for women and children, older persons

ENSURE SUSTAINABLE CONSUMPTION AND PRODUCTION PATTERNS

- 2. Achieve sustainable management and efficient use of natural resources
- 3. Halve per capita global food waste at the retail and consumer level, and reduce food losses along production and supply chains including post harvest losses
- 4. Achieve environmentally sound management of chemicals and all wastes throughout their life cycle in accordance with agreed international frameworks and significantly reduce their release to air, water and soil to minimize their adverse impacts on human health and the environment
- 5. Substantially reduce waste generation through prevention, reduction, recycling, and reuse
- 6. Encourage companies, especially large and trans national companies, to adopt sustainable practices and to integrate sustainability information into their reporting cycle
- 7. Promote public procurement practices that are sustainable in accordance with national policies and prioritie:
- 8. Ensure that people everywhere have the relevant information and awareness for sustainable development and lifestyles in
 harmony with nature

TAKE URGENT ACTION TO COMBAT CLIMATE CHANGE AND ITS IMPACTS *





- 1. Strengthen resilience and adaptive capacity to climate related hazards and natural disasters in all countries
- 2. Integrate climate change measures into national policies, strategies, and planning
- 3. Improve education, awareness raising and human and institutional capacity on climate change mitigation, adaptation, impact reduction, and early warning

*Acknowledging that the UNFCCC is the primary international, intergovernmental forum for negotiating the global response to climate change .

CONSERVE AND SUSTAINABLY USE THE OCEANS, SEAS AND MARINE RESOURCES FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT



- 1. Prevent and significantly reduce marine pollution of all kinds, particularly from land-based activities, including marine debris and nutrient pollution
- 2. Sustainably manage and protect marine and coastal ecosystems to avoid significant adverse impacts, including by strengthening their resilience, and take action for their restoration, to achieve healthy and productive oceans
- 3. Minimize and address the impacts of ocean acidification, including through enhanced scientific cooperation at all levels
- 4. Effectively regulate harvesting, and end overfishing, illegal, unreported and unregulated (IUU) fishing and destructive fishing practices and implement science-based management plans, to restore fish stocks in the shortest time feasible at least to levels that can produce maximum sustainable yield as determined by their biological characteristics
- 5. Conserve at least 10% of coastal and marine areas, consistent with national and international law and based on best available scientific information
- 6. Prohibit certain forms of fisheries subsidies which contribute to overcapacity and overfishing, and eliminate subsidies that contribute to IUU fishing, and refrain from introducing new such subsidies, recognizing that appropriate and effective special and differential treatment for developing and least developed countries should be an integral part of the WTO fisheries subsidies negotiation*
- 7. Increase the economic benefits to SIDS and LDCs from the sustainable use of marine resources, including through sustainable management of fisheries, aquaculture and tourism

PROTECT, RESTORE AND PROMOTE SUSTAINABLE USE OF TERRESTRIAL ECOSYSTEMS, SUSTAINABLY MANAGE FORESTS, COMBAT DESERTIFICATION, AND HALT AND REVERSE LAND DEGRADATION AND HALT BIODIVERSITY LOSS



- 1. Ensure conservation, restoration and sustainable use of terrestrial and inland freshwater ecosystems and their services, in particular forests, wetlands, mountains and drylands, in line with obligations under international agreements
- 2. Promote the implementation of sustainable management of all types of forests, halt deforestation, restore degraded forests, and increase afforestation and reforestation by x% globally
- Combat desertification, and restore degraded land and soil, including land affected by desertification, drought and floods, and strive to achieve a land-degradation neutral world
- 4. Ensure the conservation of mountain ecosystems, including their biodiversity, to enhance their capacity to provide benefits which are essential for sustainable development



- 5. Take urgent and significant action to reduce degradation of natural habitat, halt the loss of biodiversity, and by 2020 protect and prevent the extinction of threatened species
- 6. Ensure fair and equitable sharing of the benefits arising from the utilization of genetic resources, and promote appropriate access to genetic resources
- 7. Take urgent action to end poaching and trafficking of protected species of flora and fauna, and address both demand and supply of illegal wildlife products
- 8. Introduce measures to prevent the introduction and significantly reduce the impact of invasive alien species on land and water ecosystems, and control or eradicate the priority species
- 9. Integrate ecosystems and biodiversity values into national and local planning, development processes and poverty reduction strategies, and accounts

PROMOTE PEACEFUL AND INCLUSIVE SOCIETIES FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT, PROVIDE ACCESS TO JUSTICE FOR ALL AND BUILD EFFECTIVE, ACCOUNTABLE AND INCLUSIVE INSTITUTIONS AT ALL LEVELS





- 1. Significantly reduce all forms of violence and related death rates everywhere
- 2. End abuse, exploitation, trafficking and all forms of violence and torture against children
- 3. Promote the rule of law at the national and international levels, and ensure equal access to justice for all
- 4. Significantly reduce illicit financial and arms flows, strengthen recovery and return of stolen assets, and combat all forms of organized crime
- 5. Substantially reduce corruption and bribery in all its forms
- 6. Develop effective, accountable and transparent institutions at all levels
- 7. Ensure responsive, inclusive, participatory and representative decision-making at all levels
- 8. Broaden and strengthen the participation of developing countries in the institutions of global governance
- 9. Provide legal identity for all including birth registration
- 10. Ensure public access to information and protect fundamental freedoms, in accordance with national legislation and international agreements

STRENGTHEN THE MEANS OF IMPLEMENTATION AND REVITALIZE THE GLOBAL PARTNERSHIP FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT



FINANCE

- Strengthen domestic resource mobilization, including through international support to developing countries to improve domestic capacity for tax and other revenue collection
- Developed countries to implement fully their ODA commitments, including to provide 0.7% of GNI in ODA to developing countries of which 0.15-0.20% to least-developed countries
- Mobilize additional financial resources for developing countries from multiple sources
- Assist developing countries in attaining long-term debt sustainability through coordinated policies aimed at fostering
 debt financing, debt relief and debt restructuring, as appropriate, and address the external debt of highly indebted
 poor countries (HIPC) to reduce debt distress
- Adopt and implement investment promotion regimes for LDCs

TECHNOLOGY

- Enhance North-South, South-South and triangular regional and international cooperation on and access to science, technology and innovation, and enhance knowledge sharing on mutually agreed terms, including through improved coordination among existing mechanisms, particularly at UN level, and through a global technology facilitation mechanism when agreed
- Promote development, transfer, dissemination and diffusion of environmentally sound technologies to developing countries on favourable terms, including on concessional and preferential terms, as mutually agreed

UNITED NATIONS ZAMBIA

CAPACITY BUILDING

 Enhance international supportfor implementing effective and targeted capacity building in developing countries to support national plans to implement all sustainable development goals, including through North-South, South-South and triangular cooperation.

TRADE

Promote a universal, rules-based, open, non-discriminatory and equitable multilateral trading system under the WTO
including through the conclusion of negotiations within its Doha

DEVELOPMENT AGENDA

- Increase significantly the exports of developing countries, in particular with a view to doubting the LDC share of global exports by 2020
- Realise timely implementation of duty-free, quota-free market access on a lasting basis for all least developed countries
 consistent with WTO decisions, including through ensuring that preferential rules of origin applicable to imports from
 LDCs are transparent and simple, and contribute to facilitating market access.

SYSTEMIC ISSUES POLICY AND INSTITUTIONAL COHERENCE

- Enhance global macroeconomic stability including through policy coordination and policy coherence
- Ehenance policy coherence for sustainable development
- Respect each country's policy space and leadership to establish and implement policies for poverty eradication and sustainable development

MULTI-STAKEHOLDER PARTNERSHIPS

- Enhance the global partnership for sustainable development complemented by multi-stakeholder partnerships that
 mobilise and share knowledge, expertise, technologies, and financial resources to support the achievement of
 sustainable development goals in all countries, particularly developing countries.
- Encourage and promote effective public, public-private, and civil society partnerships, building on the experience and resourcing strategies of partnerships

DATA, MONITORING AND ACCOUNTABILITY

- By 2020, enhance capacity building support to developing countries, including for LDCs and SIDs, to increase
 significantly the availability of high-quality, timely and reliable data disaggregated by income, gender, age, race,
 ethnicity, migratory status, disability, geographic location and other characteristics relevant in national contexts
- By 2030, build on existing initiatives to develop measurements of progress on sustainable development that complement GDP, and support statistical capacity building in developing countries.
